18th Century German Bible for the German Heritage Museum

Mike and Julie McGinty of Lebanon, Ohio recently donated an 18th century German Bible to the German Heritage Museum. The Bible, which belonged to an ancestor of Julie,

was printed in Nuremberg in 1788. The full title of the Bible is: Biblia, Das ist: Die ganze Heilige Schrift des Alten und Neuen Testaments. (Nürnberg: In der Johann Andreas Andreas Endterischen Handlung, 1788). The Bible bears the inscription inside the cover that ancestor Johann Georg Linder acquired it on January 2, 1801 for 7 ½ Gulden (ca. \$4.00 at that time), which then was a lot of money to pay for a Bible. The full inscription is written in an antique German that reads as follows:

Dieses Edle Teutsche Bübel Buch habe , ich Georg Linder; von hi[e]r von dem, Ehrsamem Bürger Adam Friederich Dieterich, Buchbinder in Dürkheim D 2ten Jänner [2. Januar 1801: vor [=fuer] mich und der Meinigen Hausandacht Neu Gekauft Dafür Baar Bezahlt Sieben, Gulden virthig fünf ??? Ang.stein d 2ten Jänner 1801: ?. Johann Georg Linder

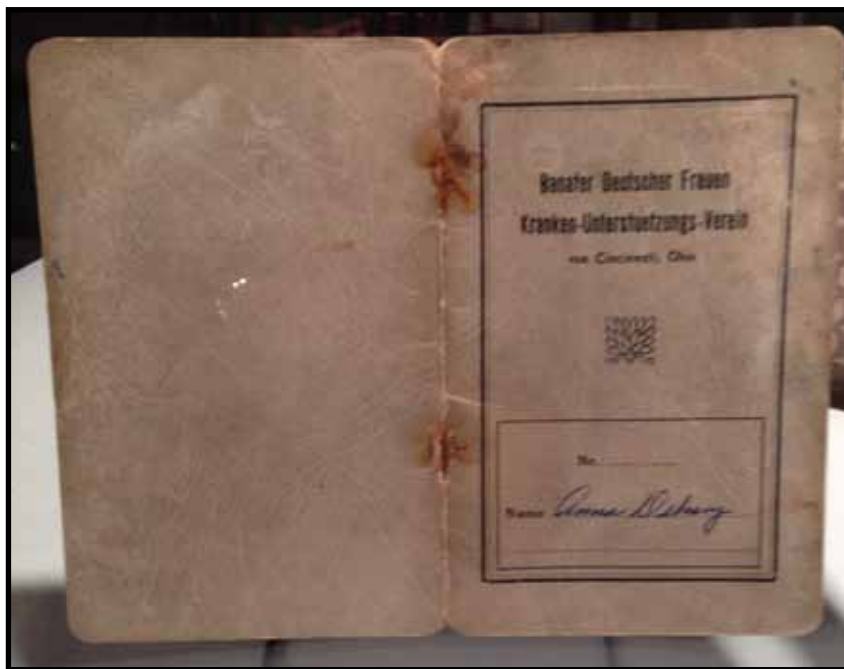
There are also several sets of photographs of buildings, people, and landscapes, including a tourism guide to the United States.

Honorable Military Discharge from Oldenburg

The following item has been placed in a frame at the museum: the honorable military discharge document for Johann Heinrich Ohnewehr from the Grand Duchy of Oldenburg. It is dated 4 August 1859, and signed by Count Banzold of the Grand Duchy.

The following information is provided about him on the military discharge paper: He was born in Damme, was Catholic, and was single. He served 6 ¼ years in the military, joining at age 21, which would make him 27 ¼ years at the time of his discharge; judging from this, his birth date would have been ca. 1832. Ed Gleason of Cincinnati donated the document.



This is a membership booklet issued by the Banater Deutscher Frauen Kranken-Unterstützungs-Verein von Cincinnati (Banat German Women's Sick Beneficial Society of Cincinnati). The booklet, which is dated 1955, belonged to Anna Dekany, and was donated to the German Heritage Museum by Robert Evans.
