Museum Lecture Series Expands *Six Presentations Featured For the Fall of 2010*

Continuing the success of our lecture programs, the German Heritage Museum is proud to sponsor six new presentations as part of our fall series. Five of these will be held at the museum, in our second floor meeting space. The other will be hosted by Northern Kentucky University.

Our first presentation comes on Sunday, September 26th. Jim Slouffman, the President of the Wagner Society of Cincinnati, will present "Das Rheingold: The Theft of Light." This discussion about the music of Richard Wagner takes place at the Museum at 2 PM.

Sunday, October 3rd, will feature Mr. William L. Selm, Architectural Historian, Indiana University-Purdue University, Indianapolis, will present, "Oldenburg, Indiana: The Architecture of the Village of Spires." This presentation will take place at 2 PM at the Museum.

On Wednesday, October 6th, Dr. Don Heinrich Tolzmann, GACL President and Curator of the German Heritage Museum, will present "German Immigration, Settlement, and Influences in the Tri-State." Volunteers Come Together For Museum Repairs

*Scraping, Sanding, Caulking,
Staining, Sawing...*

A large group of volunteers worked together to give the exterior of the Museum a major facelift this summer. The chinking between the logs was scraped and sanded to remove the old, peeling stain. Repairs were made as needed, including fresh chinking and caulk, and then all of the chinking was restained. The new stain should last us for 5 to 7 years.

Major infrastructure work included the in-



stallation of new rain gutters in both the front and back, as well as all new decking material for the front porch.

As a mid-19th century structure, our mu-



seum is always in need of some repair. The next major project is replacement of our 22 year-old air conditioner.

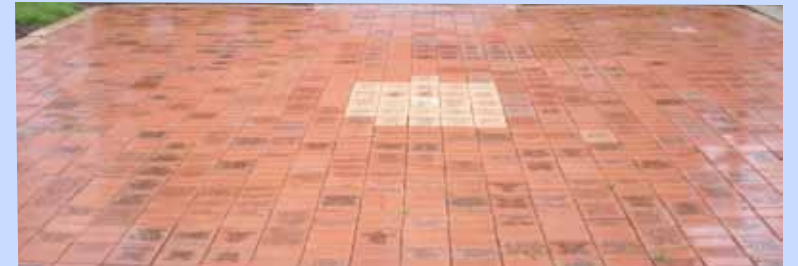

The Heritage Walk is a 24 x 26 foot brick walkway directly in front of the German Heritage Museum. The purpose of the walkway is to allow the people of Cincinnati to celebrate their German-American heritage by becoming a permanent part of the German Heritage Museum. In addition, all funds derived from this program will assist in the maintenance of the museum.

It's For Everyone

You need not be of German ancestry or even from the Cincinnati area to become a part of The Heritage Walk. You need only be proud to be a citizen interested in preserving a large part of Cincinnati's history.

Gift or Memorial

An engraved brick makes a thoughtful and lasting gift to a relative or friend. A brick can also be a way to memorialize your ancestors and others. Gift cards are also available. In addition, donations are tax deductible! Bricks are available in two sizes. The large 8x8 bricks have space for up to six lines of 14 characters each. The smaller 4x8 bricks have space for up to three lines. Large bricks are available for \$50. Small bricks are \$35, or three for \$100.
